

Woolpack Rocks

(Gumbaynggirr & Anaiwan Country)










From Native Dog Creek campground and picnic area this walk takes you through Cathedral Rock National Park to Woolpack Rocks. These ancient rocks are enormous. Take care scrambling about and enjoy the stunning district views from the top. The walk is easier than the one to Cathedral Rock. Let us begin by acknowledging the Gumbaynggirr & Anaiwan people, Traditional Custodians of the land on which we travel today, and pay our respects to their Elders past and present.







Class 4 of 6 Rough track, where fallen trees and other obstacles are likely	
Quality of track	Rough track, where fallen trees and other obstacles are likely (4/6)
Gradient	Short steep hills (3/6)
Signage	Minimal directional signs (4/6)
Infrastructure	Limited facilities (such as cliffs not fenced, significant creeks not bridged) (4/6)
Experience Required	Some bushwalking experience recommended (3/6)
Weather	Foretasted & unexpected storms and severe weather may impact on navigation and safety (4/6)

Getting to the start: From Waterfall Way, B78, Ebor.


- Turn on to Guyra Road, 17 then drive for 8.2 km
- Turn sharp left and drive for another 260 m


Before you start any journey ensure you;

- Tell someone you trust where you are going and what to do if you are late returning
- · Have adequate equipment, supplies, skills & knowledge to undertake this journey safely
- Consider weather forecasts, park/track closures & fire dangers
- Can respond to emergencies & call for help at any point
- · Are healthy and fit enough for this journey

If not, change plans and stay safe. It is okay to delay and ask people for help.







Getting started: From Native Dog campground, just off Guyra Rd, Ebor, follow the \'Barokee Native Dog Creek Track\' track from middle and back of the campsite. Head directly away from the road (initially with the toilet on your left) to cross the creek in about 130m.



Start



Find the sign at the start.



Find the Native Dog Creek Camping area at the start.

There is a fee to use this campsite. Find the Native Dog Creek at the start.



Find the toilet at the start.



After another 95 m cross the bridge (about 5 m long)



After another 20 m **veer right**.



After another 490 m cross the bridge (about 4 m long)



After another 2.5 km cross the ford.





After another 315 m come to "Woolpack Rocks".



Turn around here and retrace the main route for 3.8 km to get back to the start.
