
Martin's Lookout (Dharug & Gundungurra Country)

Return





This short and enjoyable walk visits a classic lower Blue Mountains view. Martin's Lookout is marked by a memorial plaque looking across to Lost World Lookout, on the other side of Glenbrook Creek. A great short walk if you are in the area or are passing through the Lower Blue Mountains. Let us begin by acknowledging the Dharug & Gundungurra people, Traditional Custodians of the land on which we travel today, and pay our respects to their Elders past and present.





Class 3 of 6 Formed track, with some branches and other obstacles	
Quality of track	Formed track, with some branches and other obstacles (3/6)
Gradient	Short steep hills (3/6)
Signage	Directional signs along the way (3/6)
Infrastructure	Limited facilities, not all cliffs are fenced (3/6)
Experience Required	No experience required (1/6)
Weather	Weather generally has little impact on safety (1/6)

Getting to the start: From Macquarie Road

- Turn on to Macquarie Road then drive for 235 m
- Turn sharp left onto Burns Road and drive for another 900 m
- Turn left onto Farm Road and drive for another 1.1 km
- Keep right onto Martins Lookout Trail and drive for another 1.8 km





Before you start any journey ensure you;

- If not, change plans and stay safe. It is okay to delay and ask people for help.





Getting started: From the car park, the walk heads through the cable opening in the low fence, and follows the clear sandy path past the rocky outcrop, on the left. The track winds for a short time to come around a rock outcrop with a pole (without a sign) marking the intersection, on the right.
