## Goldseekers Track

 (Ngarigo Country)Starting from Three Mile Dam campground this circuit walk takes you through woodlands and snowgrass flats. It is great for birdwatching and bushwalking during the year and also snowshoeing in winter. Let us begin by acknowledging the Ngarigo people, Traditional Custodians of the land on which we travel today, and pay our respects to their Elders past and present.

Getting to the start: From Sharp Street, B23

- Turn on to Sharp Street, B72 then drive for 230 m
- At roundabout, take exit 2 onto Sharp Street, B72 and drive for another 6.8 km
- Turn right onto Snowy Mountains Highway, B72 and drive for another 82.6 km
- Turn left onto Link Road and drive for another 5.8 km


## Before you start any journey ensure you;

- Tell someone you trust where you are going and what to do if you are late returning
- Have adequate equipment, supplies, skills \& knowledge to undertake this journey safely
- Consider weather forecasts, park/track closures \& fire dangers
- Can respond to emergencies \& call for help at any point
