## Fiddens Wharf Walking Track <br> (Darug Country)



## Before you start any journey ensure you;

- Tell someone you trust where you are going and what to do if you are late returning
- Have adequate equipment, supplies, skills \& knowledge to undertake this journey safely
- Consider weather forecasts, park/track closures \& fire dangers
- Can respond to emergencies \& call for help at any point
- Are healthy and fit enough for this journey

If not, change plans and stay safe. It is okay to delay and ask people for help.

## Share

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Getting started: From the bridge, this walk heads gently uphill along the road to the intersection with the visible concrete stairs just below the National Parks Office. From the intersection, this walk follows the road uphill, keeping the short sandstone wall and National Parks office on your left. The road soon bends left and leads up past the staff parking, to an intersection (with a track on your right) marked with a large 'Great North Walk' sign.


Two free electric BBQs hotplates in sheltered picnic area. The BBQ table is 92 cm high, 2.05 m wide and 75 cm deep. Hot plates are $45 / 45 \mathrm{~cm}$.
Then find the "Picnic Table" ( 10 m on your left).


Two timber slat picnic tables. The table is 79 cm high, 73 cm deep and 3.3 m wide. The seats are 46 cm high, 44 cm deep and 2.7 m wide (no backrest). Room for a few chairs at end. $4 \times 2.7 \mathrm{~m}$ slab.

After another 8 m pass the car park ( 5 m on your left).

Then find the "Parking Accessible" (on your left). There are 8 car parking bays in the immediate area. Three are marked mobiilty parking bays at the southern edge. The mobility parking area is ashphalt, 2.4 m wide and 6.3 m deep.


After another 55 m (at the intersection of The Great North Walk \& Max Allen Road) continue straight, to head along The Great North Walk (a walking track).

After another 315 m cross the bridge (about 5 m long)

After another 200 m cross the ford.

After another 130 m cross the bridge

Then head down the 7 stone steps (about 3 m long)

After another 55 m head down the 26 steps (about 20 m long)

Then cross the bridge (about 8 m long)


After another 6 m pass the sign (on your left).


After another 55 m head up the 26 steps (about 20 m long)After another 55 m head up the 7 stone steps (about 3 m long)

Then cross the bridge

After another 330 m cross the bridge (about 5 m long)


After another 225 m come to the viewpoint ( 9 m on your right).


After another 135 m continue straight, to head along Max Allen Road.

After another 70 m pass the toilet ( 25 m on your left).


After another 2 m continue straight, o head along Max Allen Road.


There is a shelter (about 5 m back from the start).


After another 80 m (at the intersection of Max Allen Road \& Lane Cove Depot Road) continue straight, to head along Max Allen Road.

After another 40 m find the "Schwartz
Homestead" ( 20 m on your left).


The Schwartz Homestead is a neat little white and green 1920's timber cottage with a balcony on three sides. It was probably built by orchardist George Warr, who leased the land from 1917.


After another 55 m pass the toilet ( 25 m on your left).


Start of an optional side trip: An optional side trip to Baker's Cottage



Baker's Cottage was built in 1865 as the residence of William Baker and his family. The cottage once stood in the middle of a well-kept garden and orchard. The cottage itself was once larger, with more rooms and a verandah surrounding it. The residence changed hands only twice, and was then appropriated by the Minister of Lands in 1938.
Turn around and retrace your steps back the 80 $m$ to the main route.
Back at the main route turn right and follow on from the 3.6 km waypoint.


After another 30 m pass the toilet ( 25 m on your left).


After another 180 m pass the toilet ( 15 m on your left).

After another 45 m continue straight.


After another 55 m come to the end.
