



# Mount Jerrabomberra Circuit




Starting from the end of Jerrabomberra Hill Road (paved section), Jerrabomberra, this walk takes you to the mount's summit, going through the eucalypt-dominated woodland and loops back. Let the relaxing birdsong take you away as you make your way up, and savor the exquisite views over Queanbeyan at the top. The signpost at the summit provides a great deal of information, as well as visually guiding you around. Birdwatching can be quite fruitful as the area is home to a bunch of bird species such as the Hooded Robin, Red-capped Robin and the Brown Treecreeper. Let us begin by acknowledging the Traditional Custodians of the land on which we travel today, and pay our respects to their Elders past and present.




**Class 3 of 6**  
Formed track, with some branches and other obstacles

<b>Quality of track</b>	Formed track, with some branches and other obstacles (3/6)
<b>Gradient</b>	Short steep hills (3/6)
<b>Signage</b>	Clearly signposted (2/6)
<b>Infrastructure</b>	Generally useful facilities (such as fenced cliffs and seats) (2/6)
<b>Experience Required</b>	Some bushwalking experience recommended (3/6)
<b>Weather</b>	Weather generally has little impact on safety (2/6)

**Getting to the start:** From Monaro Highway, A23

- Turn on to then drive for 50 m
- Turn left onto Lanyon Drive and drive for another 1.7 km
- Turn right onto Tomsitt Drive and drive for another 1.1 km
- At roundabout, take exit 1 onto Limestone Drive and drive for another 510 m
- At roundabout, take exit 1 onto Halloran Drive and drive for another 450 m
- Turn sharp right onto Jerrabomberra Hill Road and drive for another 85 m




## Before you start any journey ensure you;


- Tell someone you trust where you are going and what to do if you are late returning

- Are healthy and fit enough for this journey


If not, change plans and stay safe. It is okay to delay and ask people for help.












**Getting started:** Starting from the end of Jerrabomberra Hill Road (paved section), head towards the green metal gate with a "ROAD CLOSED" sign on it, along the pavement. Pass through the gap and continue straight to join the dirt fire trail veering slightly right, moving directly away from the gate. After around 20 metres, turn left into the woodland and follow the dirt trail to continue along Mount Jerrabomberra Circuit.




**P** There is a car park (about 5 m back from the start).

After 5 m head through/around the gate.




After another 185 m **continue straight**.




After another 225 m **continue straight**.

After another 145 m **continue straight**.




After another 130 m pass the water tap (on your left).




After another 305 m **continue straight**.

After another 105 m pass the "Mount Jerrabomberra" (65 m on your right).

**Start of an optional side trip:** A highly recommended side trip taking you to the lookout at the top.




After another 80 m pass the "Mount Jerrabomberra" (20 m on your right).







Turn around and retrace your steps back the 170 m to the main route.

Back at the main route ERROR >360 and follow on from the 2.1 km waypoint.



After another 380 m **continue straight**.





After another 25 m come to the end.
