


Harewood Track

30 min to 50 min






Starting from the car park on Scotsdale Road, Scotsdale, this return walk is a short one that is suitable for families. There is a picnic table at the end of the walk if you want to rest a little with scents of eucalyptus, and the signatures along the trail give information about Denmark's history and the plantation in the area. Karri trees also make it possible for birdwatching for the interested. Let us begin by acknowledging the Traditional Custodians of the land on which we travel today, and pay our respects to their Elders past and present.




Before you start any journey ensure you;


- Tell someone you trust where you are going and what to do if you are late returning

- If not, change plans and stay safe. It is okay to delay and ask people for help.








Getting started: From the car park on Scotsdale Road (800 metres west of the intersection with Walter Road), pass through the line of bollards before crossing over the creek on the footbridge and then follow the dirt track to reach your destination.



At the intersection of Harewood Forest Walk Trail & Scotsdale Road **Start** heading along *Harewood Forest Walk Trail* (a footpath).

Find the car park at the start.



Continue another 790 m to find the end. Then turn around here and retrace the main route for 800 m to get back to the start.
