

Baigup Wetland Walk (Wadjuk Noongar Country)











Starting from the car park at the end of Milne Street, Bayswater, this walk takes you to Baigup Wetland and back. This walk is suitable for families with small children who wants a guick getaway while still offering a unique native flora and hosting several waterbirds. There are areas for picnicking and facilities such as parking, a playground and bathrooms as well. The area is sacred to the Wadjuk Noongar people of Perth, and there are QR codes on the benches along the walk that will give you more insight into the historical background. The sedge plains and amazing paperbark trees are remnants of the original fringing vegetation, and Baigup is considered nationally as a Coastal Saltmarsh Threatened Ecological Community (TEC) because of this. The walk can be completed via cycling as well. Let us begin by acknowledging the Wadjuk Noongar people, Traditional Custodians of the land on which we travel today, and pay our respects to their Elders past and present.

Getting to the start: From Guildford Road, 51, Bayswater.


- Turn on to then drive for 560 m
- Turn left onto Frinton Street and drive for another 120 m
- Turn right onto Crowther Street and drive for another 150 m
- Turn left onto Neville Street and drive for another 115 m
- Turn right onto Milne Street and drive for another 225 m
- Turn right and drive for another 215 m


Before you start any journey ensure you;

- Tell someone you trust where you are going and what to do if you are late returning
- Have adequate equipment, supplies, skills & knowledge to undertake this journey safely
- Consider weather forecasts, park/track closures & fire dangers
- Can respond to emergencies & call for help at any point
- Are healthy and fit enough for this journey

If not, change plans and stay safe. It is okay to delay and ask people for help.







Getting started: From the car park at the end of Milne Street (approximately 230 metres west of Bayswater Sea Scout Hall), walk towards the chain gates between metal bollards. After you pass the gate, follow the paved track to continue along Baigup Wetland.



Start



There is a toilet (about 70 m back from the start).

Mo-Su 06:00-20:00



Find the water tap at the start.



Find the car park at the start.





After another 100 m continue straight.



After another 450 m continue straight.
