


Severs Beach is a fantastic spot on the Pambula River with its crystal clear waters and sandy beach. The beach is backed by Aboriginal sites of significance, with many middens in the area. The beach also boasts two wood fired BBQ settings in a nice grassy area. A great spot for a picnic and to wet the toes. Let us begin by acknowledging the Yuin people, Traditional Custodians of the land on which we travel today, and pay our respects to their Elders past and present.

Getting to the start: From Princes Highway, A1

- Turn on to Haycock Road then drive for 4.7 km



Before you start any journey ensure you;

- Consider weather forecasts, park/track closures & fire dangers
- Can respond to emergencies & call for help at any point





Getting started: From the intersection, the walk follows the 'Severs Beach 500m' sign down the hill, past the gate. The track winds down the hill and then along a boardwalk to the water. The boardwalk leads the walk to a small clearing with bbq pits and a small beach.




Severs Walk Parking **Start** heading along *Severs Beach Walk* (a vehicle track).



After 15 m to find the "Severs Walk Parking".



After another 20 m head through/around the gate.



Continue another 630 m to find the end. Then turn around here and retrace the main route for 660 m to get back to the start.



About 70 m past the end is "Severs Beach".



Severs Beach is a sandy beach on the eastern bank of the Pambula River, in Ben Boyd National Park. The beach faces towards the ocean but is about 1.4km from the mouth of the river, making this a pleasant area for picnicking, swimming, fishing, boating or just relaxing. There are a couple of metal fire pits, a clear grassy area, a rock shelf and a small lagoon. The chances of seeing some of the resident kangaroos are pretty good. The beach is accessible by boat or a short walking track (partly boardwalk). There is no surf life saving patrol at this beach.
