## Jennifer Street Boardwalk <br> (Gadigal \& Bidjigal Country)

Getting started: From the end of Jennifer St (near Marconi PI), Little Bay, this walk follows the concrete footpath between the timber bollards ( 1.7 m gap), past the 'Botany Bay National Park - Jennifer Street Lands' sign. After about 25 m , the walk passes the large sheltered 'Eastern Suburbs Banksia Scrub' sign shelter to find a timber seat. The timber boardwalk leads gently downhill through the dense heath for about 160 m to pass the fenced 'revegetation area'. The boardwalk continues to lead through the forest with the occasional water glimpses for another 80 m where the path starts to lead moderately steeply downhill for about 15 m before starting to mostly level out again. At the end of the timber boarwalk, the walk follows the concrete path to find another timber seat. From here the walk continues along the footpath for 35 m to pass the 'Jennifer Street Boardwalk' sign, head through the narow timber bollards and come to Cape Banks Rd, La Perouse next to the golf course.


At the intersection of Jennifer Street Boardwalk \& Jennifer Street Start heading along Jennifer Street Boardwalk (a footpath).

After 25 m find the "Jennifer Street Boardwalk" (on your right).


Jennifer Boardwalk provides you with an elevated view through a rare and endangered ecological community known as the Eastern Suburbs Banksia Scrub. This community of native plants is protected under the Threatened Species Conservation Act. These Banksia once occupied around 5,300 hectares of land between North Head and Botany Bay in Sydneyâ $€^{\text {m }}$ s eastern suburbs. Currently, surviving stands totalling approximately 146 hectares have been recorded by the local government areas of Botany, Randwick, Waverley, and Manly .
After another 20 m pass the sign (on your right).


A timber slat bench seat, 42 cm high, 31 cm deep and 2.1 m wide with a 38 cm high backrest.
After another 250 m find the "Wheelchair Steep"
( 8 m on your left).


An approximalty 15 m section of the boardwalk is $1.5: 12$ steep.

After another 55 m find the "Seat" ( 6 m on your left).


A timber slat bench seat, 45 cm high, 32 cm deep and 2.1 m wide with a 38 cm high backrest.
After another 25 m come to "Pinch Point".


Timber bollard pinchpoints around edge of carpark. The gap between the bollard are 84 cm they are 85 cm high.
